There is in all of us a need to be recognized and feel important. Children especially feel this need. No matter how many children you have, each should be allowed his or her own "specialness." Find activities that will bring out this specialness in each child.

Children respond to chores and tasks with a more positive attitude when they feel that what they do is important to the family. Assign tasks that engender pride according to age. A small child could be "in charge" of making sure the tables in the living room are dusted and polished. This becomes special when you openly admire the child's work: "Jimmy (Jenny) is the best table-polisher in this whole house!"



Of course, you should make it a point to give each child a chance to earn the right to wear the I AM SPE-CIAL badge this week. If necessary, copy the badge and make one for each child.








A "Little Way" to Go



Why, do you think, Jesus tells the people to become like children? What is it about children that Jesus loves so much?







This week you heard the story of the rich young man who loved Jesus very much. The young man had everything any young man could want: fancy clothes, good food, and a nice home. This young man tried to be very good. He always obeyed his parents. He didn't lie or cheat. He always followed God's commandments.

You can become great by making a cheerful card for someone in the hospital.






