

FROM THE PASTORS DESK

"Fr. Steve"

Life is full of surprises for one who believes. Today's Gospel presents one of the most beautiful scenes in the Bible: it is the Lord, risen from the dead, who prepares breakfast on the beach for the disciples who make a miraculous catch of fish as they follow the directions of Jesus. Peter is given the opportunity to profess his love for Jesus three times, just as he denied Jesus three times on the night of the Last Supper. Peter and the disciples are changed forever by their meetings with Jesus risen from the dead. We hear in the First Reading how they bear witness to Jesus and are "rejoicing that they had been found worthy to suffer dishonor for the sake of the name" (of the Lord Jesus). Christ comes unexpectedly to each one of us, wherever we are, whatever we are doing. All that is needed is faith in Jesus risen from the dead. He is worthy "to receive power and riches, wisdom and strength, honor and glory and blessing" (as we hear in the Second Reading from the Book of Revelation today).
