2nd Sunday of Easter - April 27th, John 20:19-31

Reflection: In this week's action-packed Gospel, Jesus appears twice to the disciples while they hide behind locked doors in mortal fear. Thomas is not among the disciples the first time and refuses to believe that Jesus appeared unless he can touch the wounds himself. Jesus wastes no time in proving himself to Thomas a week later. Thomas becomes a believer only after he can physically touch Jesus' wounds, but Jesus tells us clearly that "Blessed are those who have not seen and have believed."

**Faith Question:** What are the locked doors in my life? Is it difficult for me to trust and open my heart to the Lord without seeing Him?

**Faith Response:** This week I will strengthen the faith of someone who is faltering.

# Safeguard Our Children Recognizing Signs of Child Abuse & Neglect

A key to reporting child abuse and neglect is being able to recognize common indicators. In children, the following signs may signal the presence of child abuse or neglect: Shows sudden changes in behavior or school performance. Has not received help for physical or medical problems brought to the parents' attention. Is always watchful, as though preparing for something bad to happen. Is overly compliant, passive, or withdrawn. Comes to school or other activities early, stays late, and does not want to go home. 

# THE SECOND SUNDAY OF EASTER DIVINE MERCY SUNDAY

The Church celebrates Easter as a festival of fifty days from Easter Sunday to Pentecost, seeing this whole season as "one feast day...one 'Great Sunday". Through our faith in Jesus risen from the dead we can live with joy in all circumstances. Sometimes we may have doubts and questions. For us and all believers Jesus speaks awesome words to Thomas in today's Gospel: "Have you come to believe because you have seen me? Blessed are those who have not seen and have believed." For us, faith comes through hearing God's Word and trusting in this revelation, especially as made known through the community of faith, charity, prayers and worship outlined in today's First Reading from Acts of the Apostles 2:42ff. In the Second Reading from 1 Peter 1.3ff we hear a great hymn celebrating our new birth in Baptism: God "in his great mercy gave us a new birth to a living hope through the resurrection of Jesus Christ from the dead." May our faith in Jesus risen from the dead in the glory of Easter deepen and grow stronger each day in this Easter season.
