

FOURTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME **FEBRUARY 1, 2015**

Jesus teaches with authority and heals with power: this is the picture we have in today's Gospel (Mark 1:21-28). "A new teaching with authority" is how the people describe their experience of Jesus. He fulfills the promise that Moses speaks about in the First Reading that "a prophet like me will the Lord, your God, raise up for you from among your own kin" (Deuteronomy 18:15-20). Jesus not only teaches but acts with great love as he heals the man with the unclean spirit. In Jesus we see incarnate God's love, gentleness, caring for each person, especially anyone afflicted in any way. What is our response? St. Paul tells us that we must give a wholehearted response, free of anxieties, in sincere devotion to God (1 Corinthians 7:32-35). Whether we are married or unmarried, let us keep our eyes on the Lord, listening to his teaching and being healed in his love.

- On Monday we celebrate the Feast of the Presentation of the Lord Jesus in the Temple in Jerusalem forty days after the joyful feast of his Birth. Today's feast has been called "the last echo of Christ~ mas". As Simeon says in the Gospel for this feast: Jesus is "a light for revelation to the Gentiles." May we always walk in his light!
- On Tuesday the traditional Blessing of Throats on the Feast of St. Blaise will take place after the 7:45 AM Mass.

Faith Reflection: In today's Gospel, Jesus is teaching in the synagogue and the people are astonished at his teaching; he teaches with authority. A man in the crowd with an unclean spirit recognizes Jesus as the Holy One and calls out to him. Jesus calls for the unclean spirit to come out of the man. The people again are amazed. Jesus has the authority to command even unclean spirits and they obey him. The people in the time of Moses begged for such a prophet That promise is fulfilled definitively in Jesus Christ, whose authority astonishes the assembled crowd. Obeying the authority of Christ makes us more human and fills us with a burning desire for things truly great.

Faith Question: Is my attitude toward Jesus the same as or different toward other authorities?

Faith response: I will let Jesus be the authority of my thoughts and actions this week.
