

FROM THE PASTORS DESK Fr. Steve

February 8, 2015

Human misery and suffering face us in today's Readings. Job, the good man who had everything, loses family, wealth and health and ends up crying out in misery: "I shall not see happiness again" (Job 7:7). Does God really care about suffering? The answer is very clear: Jesus is the healing presence of God. In today's Gospel (Mark 1:29-39) Jesus heals Simon Peter's mother-in-law and then cured all who were ill and came to the door for healing. He is the Lord "who heals the broken-hearted and binds up their wounds" (Psalm 147:3 today). Our challenge as followers of Jesus is to make present his compassion and caring by responding in practical ways that lead to healing of body and spirit of people suffering in our world. Sometimes the need is overwhelming. Jesus shows how we can begin as he draws aside and prays. All we say and do must begin and end in prayer with Jesus who is the healing presence of God in our world.

The largest consumers of Internet pornography are children between the ages of 12-17. More than half of boys and a third of girls have seen pornography before their teenage years. Thirty-five percent of young teenage boys (13-14 years old) say that they have seen pornography "more times than I can count." By the age of 18, more than nine out of 10 boys, and six out of 10 girls have seen pornography online.2 The best defense against allowing pornography to reach our children is to stop it before it begins or to address it immediately.

Reflecting on God's Word

Sue loves to iron clothes. In the process, she says, she also irons out her life, all its wrinkles and creases. She says she can stand neither her clothes nor her life when they're all rumpled. John runs every day. A lot of folks do. He hasn't missed a day in five years. But it's also where he and they pace out the rhythms of their lives. More than one frazzled mother has locked herself in the bathroom for twenty minutes of solitude and quasi-peace. Sometimes deserts look like bathrooms. Even teenagers know the need, so they crank up some tunes, stretch out on their beds, and listen beyond the music to the melodies played upon their lives.

I suspect there is a lot going on in those spaces. That's where kids get raised and loves get sorted and businesses are merged and decisions unraveled and re-raveled. But somewhere in the midst of it all we also make some decisions about who and what we want to become in this life—at any age. That's where goodness has a chance to surface and values are affirmed and commitments are remade for the umpteenth time and faith sprouts forth. And then it becomes prayer, out of the silence and the stillness and the darkness of time spent alone.
