

WHOLE COMMUNITY FAITH SHARING Week of July 21st — Gospel of Luke

Reflection: This reading again gives us a lesson on prayer and balance. Martha approaches Jesus with a problem and the solution she wants to that problem, and the answer she receives is not the one she wanted. On the other hand, at the wedding feast at Cana, Mary, Jesus' mother, pointed out the problem to Jesus and left it up to Him to work out the solution. Martha and Mary typify a problem that we all encounter today "the act of balancing". According to the words of Jesus, Martha was being distracted by many things. The work that Martha was doing was not necessary. Martha created her own work. It was not demanded of her. She could have sat alongside Mary in order to be enriched by the spiritual foods that Jesus was feeding Mary. Mary is not better that Martha but Mary listens in order be become who she is supposed to be. Change must be marked by deliberate periods of listening and prayer. It is good to contemplate that like Martha, we can get lost in the things to do or to be done rather than remember like Mary, to become a people we are supposed to be.

Question: Which response to God's call is more natural to me -- prayer or good works? Why?

Faith Response: This week, I will challenge myself in my faith life to balance prayer and good works.


