

Recently there have been a number of reports about Teen Sexual Harassment in the workplace. Often, it is the teen's first job. They have a new sense of freedom yet they are vulnerable. Some teens are finding themselves on the receiving end of sexual advancements & harassments from their adult supervisors. The earmarks of a predator were quite visible: established a friendship; shared secrets; called & texted the victim and physical contact escalated into a sexual relationship. We need to teach them the warning signs of predators, to say "No" to advances and to report it. TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

It's high summer now, school is out, the pace of work slows, and some people drift away. There are visitors in the churches every summer, and familiar faces are "among the missing." Some find the summer's call more appealing than the summons of the church bells. Many, however, would not dream of missing a Sunday, and so they make their way to Mass in unfamiliar places, watching the locals for clues as to when to sit or stand, where the Communion stations are. In answering the call, they keep the "sabbatical" rhythm of the Christian life: every seventh day, the Body of Christ assembles for worship.

For centuries, there was no obligation to Sunday Mass in the sense of a written law, but Christians have always yearned to be together on Sunday. In the city of Abitina, during a persecution by the Emperor Diocletian, a group of Christians were urged to stop worshiping together on Sundays. They responded, "Then take our lives, for without the Sunday we cannot live." By a curious coincidence, the appointed readings today center us on thoughts of peace. On our Independence Day, the experience of worship situates us in community, and evokes a commitment from us to be advocates of peace in all aspects of our society's life.

Action on SB 131

Our California Catholic Bishops are asking all Catholics to contact their State Assembly representatives to oppose SB 131 (Beall). This measure has passed the State Senate and is due to come up for a vote in the State Assembly late in July. The measure once again eliminates the civil statue of limitations for only a select number of child abuse victims as it only applies to private and non-profit employers like private schools, the Catholic Church and other Churches, the YMCA, Little League and other similar organizations. Most abuse victims are left without recourse as public schools and colleges and universities and local governments, and the actual perpetrators of abuse, all have complete immunity for any incidents of child sex abuse that took place before 2009. This is not the way to assure justice for victims of child abuse. The Catholic Bishops of California are asking you to contact your local State Assembly representative to vote "No" on SB 131.
