The Fourth Sunday of Lent

The joy of the Lenten season is emphasized this Sunday as we celebrate "Laetare" or "Rejoice" Sunday. The priest may wear rose colored vestments and we are encouraged to be joyful as we look forward to Easter. Our Scripture Readings give us lots of reasons for joy. St. Paul tells us: "God, who is rich in mercy, because of the great love he had for us, even when we were dead in our transgressions, brought us to life with Christ" (Ephesians 2:4ff). In the Gospel we hear the famous words of John 3:16: "For God so loved the world that he gave his only Son, so that everyone who believes in him might not perish but might have eternal life." The First Reading tells the story of the people of Israel being unfaithful to God and ending up in exile in Babylon; but God raised up Cyrus, King of Persia, to set them free and allow them to return to rebuild the Temple in Jerusalem. Like the Israelites, our journey of faith may take many different forms. Yet God is always reaching out to call us back to his love, mercy, light, truth and joy.
