As we begin the last two weeks of Lent, we focus more and more on Jesus as he moves towards his agony, death and resurrection. In today's Gospel (John 12:20ff) Jesus says: "The hour has come". Now is the time for him to go through suffering and death to reign gloriously from the Cross (in John's Gospel the Cross is the throne of the King of All rather than an instrument of suffering). Yet in John's Gospel Jesus still suffers. We hear Jesus say today: "I am troubled now." In the Second Reading (from Hebrews 5:7-9) we are told that Jesus "offered prayers and supplications with loud cries and tears to God...Son though he was, he learned obedience from what he suffered." For Jesus, and for us, obeying God's will means facing the Cross. The grain of wheat must fall to the ground and die so new life can come forth (Jesus tells us in today's Gospel). As we walk with Jesus in these last days of Lent to the Cross on Good Friday and Resurrection at Easter may we die to selfishness and live for God and others so we may come to joyful new life at Easter in Christ.

Safeguard Our Children **Tips To Help Protect Children From Sexting**

Before buying your child a cell phone, set rules for its use, including what sort of information and images are appropriate to share via text. Know what safeguards are available on your child's phone, such as turning off and/or blocking texting and picture features. Talk to your child about the possible social, academic, and legal consequences of sexting. They could face humiliation, lose educational opportunities, and get in trouble with the law. Encourage your child to not be a bystander or an instigator. If he or she receives a "sext," discuss why it is important that he or she not forward the image to anyone else. Remind your child that they can talk to you if they receive a nude picture on their cell phone.
