

In today's Gospel we hear of the Transfiguration of Jesus. He takes Peter, James and John up a high mountain by themselves. He is transfigured before them so that "his face shone like the sun and his clothes became white as light." As they witness his heavenly glory, they hear the voice of God the Father saying: "This is my beloved Son, with whom I am well pleased; listen to him." The disciples are filled with awe. But as they come down the mountain, they hear mention again of the coming death and resurrection of Jesus. As they were with him on the Mount of Transfiguration, so they will be with him in his agony in the Garden of Gethsemani. During Lent Jesus calls us to journey with him to Calvary and to East~ er glory. As we journey with Jesus, we also experience moments of great joy and hope and inspiration. These moments encourage us to face the inevitable moments of agony with hope in ultimate resurrection.
