





#### WHOLE COMMUNITY FAITH SHARING Week of March 17th – John 8:1-11

**Reflection:** This Sunday's Gospel, the Fifth Sunday of Lent, the scribes and Pharisees bring an adulteress to Jesus in order to see if they could bring some charge against him for his actions. As they press for action, Jesus takes his time in answering, by saying, "Let the one among you who is without sin be the first to throw a stone..." This diffuses the situation and the woman is sent safely on her way with the instruction "do not sin any more."

Faith Question: How can I resist the feeling to 'cast the stone' when I disapprove of someone's behavior?

Faith Response: I will write "Let the one among you who is without sin be the first to throw a stone" on a piece of paper and put it where it can easily be seen. Then, I will pay attention to television, radio, newpaper and especially my own conversations.
