Safeguard Our Children A Good Photo Could Save A Child's Life

One of the most important tools for law enforcement to use in the case of a missing child is an updated (every six months), good school-portrait quality, head-and-shoulders color photograph of the child in which the face is clearly seen. The background should be plain or solid so it does not distract from the subject. When possible, the photograph should be in a digitized form, and available on a compact disk (CD), as opposed to just a hard copy. This minimizes the time necessary to scan, resize, and make color corrects before disseminating it to law enforcement. The photograph should have space for accurate, narrative description useful to identify the child such as name, nickname, height, weight, sex, age, eye color, identifying marks, glasses, and braces.

The theme of this Sunday's Readings is God's abiding love and caring watchfulness for all. No matter how unfaithful or irreligious we become, God still loves and watches over us. In the First Reading from Isaiah, God is likened to a mother with an infant child. Even should the mother "forget her infant, be without tenderness for the child in her womb, even should she forget, I will never forget you" God tells us today. In the Gospel Jesus tells us not to worry or be anxious about life or food or clothes. As God blesses the birds and the flowers of the field, how much more does he bless us in his abiding, unending, generous love. We must "seek first the Kingdom of God and his righteousness and all these things will be given you besides."
