

"They'll know we are Christians by our love" ~ these are the opening words of a Catholic hymn that was very popular in the sixties and seventies. This hymn captures the essence of being a follower of Jesus who tells us in today's Gospel: "This is my commandment: love one another as I love you. No one has greater love than this, to lay down one's life for one's friends."(from John 15:9-17). In the Second Reading we are told: "Beloved, let us love one another, because love is of God...Whoever is without love, does not know God, for God is love." (from 1 John 4:7~10). The love that these Scriptures speak about is as simple as the kindness we show to each other at Church, at home, at school, at work, at the store, on the freeway, wherever we are. It also involves forgetting self to love and care and forgive the other person and to start over again with each other in a new friendship in Jesus. "See how these Christians love one another" one of the great attractions to the Christian way of life at the end of the first century, we are told. Living the way of Jesus can mean great surprises for us as St. Peter discovers in the First Reading today when he sees the Holy Spirit of God's love come down upon the Gentiles or non-Jews in the household of Cornelius (Acts of the Apostles 10:25ff) May we too be happily surprised in finding God's love present within us and in each other.

• In the Western United States we will celebrate the Feast of the Ascension of the Lord on Sunday, May 17 this year rather than on Ascension Thursday. 


