

Update on Major Renovation Projects from this summer:

We expect that this week-end work will be completed on renovating the men's rest

room in the Parish Hall because of a methane gas leak there. A major overhaul of the men's rest room was necessary and the place looks much better now. Some minor improvements were made to the women's rest room. Both rest rooms are now wheelchair accessible.

Awning installations are taking place at the house and parking area of the Pastor Emeritus and also at the Parish Hall.

One more project has now surfaced: the need to replace the grease trap in the Parish Hall kitchen.

We are very grateful to five families who have donated \$26,711 to fund all the projects and one who has also donated \$2,500 to replace the grease trap in the Parish Hall Kitchen. We are also very grateful to a parish family who donated new tables and chairs for the renovated school faculty room. Our parish is blessed with such a generous response.

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK: Fr. Steve

This week-end we celebrate our faith in the Communion of Saints, the great family of God made up of all baptized Christians here on earth, those on the journey to heaven (the Holy Souls) and all who are blessed Saints in the presence of God in our home in heaven On Sat~ urday, November 1 we honor All the Saints, the countless men and women, boys and girls who were faithful in living out God's way of life on earth, with the help of God's grace and mercy, and are now in the presence of God in heaven. On Sunday, November 2 we pray for all who have died, for their purification and preparation on their way to heaven. We talk of purgatory and may ask: what is purgatory? We all die in our human imperfections. We can think of purgatory as a purging, purifying, transforming experience, the stripping away of all selfishness and residue from the past so we are completely open to God's life and love and can enter the presence of the all holy God. We pray: "Eternal rest grant unto them, O Lord. May they rest from their labors, for they are blessed by God, their good works accompany them" (from a prayer based on Revelation 14:13). What a blessed week-end for all - a source of joy, hope and love in the family of God as we pray for each other!

• In today's bulletin you will find a summary financial report for the parish for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2014. Once again the parish had an operating deficit because our parish expenses exceeded our Sunday giving. The loss of \$31,870 is an improvement over the 2013 loss of \$43,408 and the 2012 loss of \$78,628. The lower deficit is due to the increased generosity of parishioners and friends in the Sunday collection, many efforts to reduce parish expenses and the generosity of several parishioners who made special gifts to help fund parish needs and programs.

One reason for the deficit is that many parishioners are away traveling or unable to come to Our Lady of Mount Carmel every Sunday. Your generous giving is so important in funding all the parish worship, religiouse, educational and service programs of the parish.
