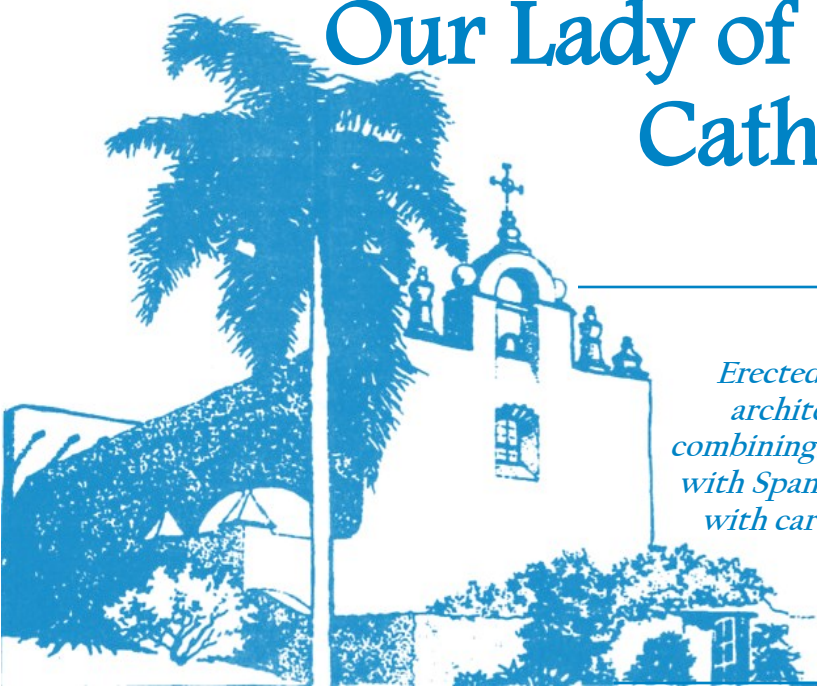


Our Lady of Mount Carmel Catholic Church

On Sunday, November 1st/2nd the annual financial report for the parish for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2014 was presented and it showed a deficit of \$31,870 for the year. The average Sunday collection would need to reach \$8,500 a Sunday to avoid another parish operating deficit this year.

On this last Sunday of the Church year, we celebrate the Feast of Christ the King, honoring Jesus as our King, our Leader and Lord. When we think of kings we think of someone who holds power over others and demands great respect. Jesus is different.

He is the True Shepherd: "I myself will pasture my sheep. I myself will give them rest, says the Lord God. The lost I will seek out, the strayed I will bring back, the injured I will bind up, the sick I will heal..."(we hear in Ezekiel 34:11ff. our First Reading today).

Jesus is the Life Giver: "Just as in Adam all die, so too in Christ shall all be brought to life" St. Paul tells us in 1 Corinthians 15:20f., our Second Reading. Paul speaks of Christ risen from the dead as the one who conquers death - "the last enemy to be destroyed is death".

Jesus is our Savior and Judge who points out to us today in Matthew's Gospel 25:31ff that our final judgment will be based on the simple human caring and love we show to each person, especially to those most in need.

What a King we have in Jesus! To him be honor, glory and praise now and forever!
