

WHOLE COMMUNITY FAITH SHARING Week of November 30th — Mark: 13:33~37

Faith Reflection: In today's Gospel, Jesus is exhorting his followers to states of readiness: "Be watchful! Be alert!" These are strong words which catch the ear of His disciples. They are also words by which Jesus himself has lived his personal mission of redeeming this world. This is a call to action unlike most others in the Gospels. Jesus uses a little image which is important, but can be easily overlooked. Jesus uses the image of a land owner who goes on a journey, but leaves his servants, "each with his own work" to do. The challenge is not just to stay awake, but awake so as to do the work of bringing light and life to God's world. Waiting and watching out of fear is passive and paralyzing, but waiting in faith is eager and exciting. We are called to start living our faith today and create a better world for others.

Faith Question: At this watchful time, how faithful do I feel I am being to God's plan for me?

Faith Response: At least one thing that I will do this week to help me remember that Jesus is coming is

FROM THE PASTORS DESK Fr. Steve

Advent means "Coming". Today we begin a new Church year and the season of Advent, a time of preparing for the Coming of Christ into our lives at Christmas and at the end of the world. The First Sunday of Advent emphasizes the final coming of Christ in glory. In the First Reading (from Isaiah 63:16ff) we hear the cry: "Return for the sake of your servants...Would that you might meet us doing right..." We also hear our need for God's coming: "...we have all withered like leaves, and our guilt carries us away like the wind." We pray that the Lord may come for he is "our father, we are the clay and you the potter: the work of your hands." In the Gospel (Mark 13:33~37) Jesus tells us: "Be watchful! Be alert!" for his coming. Like the gatekeeper we must be on the watch, open to the coming of the Lord in glory at the end of the world and also in his coming each day. Christ comes in Advent in our prayer, in reading the Holy Bible, in the Eucharist, in the ordinary events and meetings of each day, in each Christmas card we send or gift we prepare. The Lord comes! Let us be open to his Coming!
