Faith Reflection: Today is the feast of the Dedication of Lateran Basilica, the cathedral church of the Pope in Rome. It is the "mother church" of the worlds' Catholic Churches. The Gospel reading tells of Jesus enraged at the money changers and those taking advantage of pilgrims to the temple in Jerusalem. Nobody realizes what Jesus means by this statement until Jesus is raised from the dead. ### 2013-2014 FINANCIAL REPORT

Last Sunday a summary financial report for our parish for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2014 was presented. Many thanks were expressed for the increased generosity of parishioners and friends this past year. Yet we still ended the fiscal year with a deficit of \$31,870. Since July 1st, we have had lower Offertory collections. On the weekend of October 18th/19th, we received only \$4,084. To avoid another parish operating deficit, the parish would need to receive \$8,500 each week. We ask each person to reflect on these questions:

Does your Sunday Offertory giving show your love and thanksgiving to God for all his blessings and your love for our Parish? In your love for God and our Church community, can you make a commitment to increase your Sunday giving?

FROM THE PASTORS ALESK : Fr. Steve

Today we celebrate the Feast of the Dedication of St. John Lateran Basilica in Rome, the Cathedral Church of Rome and its bishop, the successor of St. Peter. This Church is called "the mother and head of all churches of Rome and the world", a statement which brings out the unity of all Roman Catholics under the leadership of our Holy Father, Pope Francis, Bishop of Rome. All Cathedrals and Church buildings are sacred space where we meet the Lord and where all are welcome. Yet we also need to remember the words of St. Paul in the Second Reading today (1 Corinthians 3:9ff.) that we, the People of God, are "God's building" and "that you are the temple of God, and that the Spirit of God dwells in you." Paul challenges us to remember: "for the temple of God, which you are, is holy." We must have great respect for each other because through Baptism into Christ we are his Church, his temple on earth. One in mind and heart in unity of faith with the Holy Father Pope Francis and the bishops we are called to grow in holiness in Christ, especially as we assemble in our Church building to worship God in our celebration of the life, death and resurrection of Jesus.

\* Altar servers are a great blessing for our parish. We show our appreciation to our altar servers at the 12 noon Mass this Sunday, followed by fun, games and food at the parish school grounds.

\* Tuesday, November 11, is Veterans Day. We honor all who have died and all who have served and are serving our nation in the Armed Forces. We pray God's blessings on our veterans and for peace. Mass will be offered at 7:45 AM on Tuesday. The Parish Office will be closed on Tuesday in observance of the national holiday.

\* Father Steve, our Pastor, leaves this Monday for a short visit to Ireland for a family celebration. He will return to the parish on Monday night, November 17th.



Update on Major Renovation Projects from this summer:

Work is now completed on renovating the men's rest room in the Parish Hall because of a methane gas leak there. A major

overhaul of the men's rest room was necessary and the place looks much better now. Some minor improvements were made to the women's rest room. Both rest rooms are now wheelchair accessible.

Awning installations are now complete at the house and parking area of the Pastor Emeritus and the new awning at is being installed.

One more project has now surfaced: the need to replace the grease trap at the Parish Hall kitchen.

We are very grateful to six families who have donated \$27,711 to fund all the projects and one who has also donated \$2,500 to replace the grease trap at the Parish Hall kitchen. We are also very grateful to a parish family who donated new tables and chairs for the renovated school faculty room. Our parish is very blessed with such generosity.
