

Faith Reflection: In the parable of the Pharisee and the tax collector, the tax collector is completely aware of the enormity of his sins and therefore of his unworthiness, yet the Pharisee is proud, boastful and feels he is without sin. PARISH FINANCES

At the last meeting of the Parish Finance Council, the Annual Parish Financial Report to the Archdiocese of Los Angeles was approved. A summary of the Report will be presented in this bulletin soon. Once again the parish had a deficit in the operations of the parish for the financial year ending June 30th. We are dealing with a deficit in parish operations because our parish expenses exceed our Sunday giving. The loss of \$43,408 is a significant improvement over the 2012 loss of \$78,628, due to the increased generosity of parishioners in the Sunday collections, many efforts to reduce parish expenses, and the generosity of several parishioners who made special gifts to help fund parish needs and programs. Our hope is to eliminate a parish deficit this year. We ask all parishioners to consider your regular Sunday giving to the parish and, if possible, to increase your Sunday giving by 10% or more. Special gifts and bequests from parishioners and friends are also very much needed. Many parishioners are out of town for different reasons during the year. Our plan is to provide the opportunity for internet giving once our new parish web site is up and running very soon so you can show your love for God and our Church even when you are unable to come to your parish of Mount Carmel on certain Sundays.

"Fr. Steve"

In the Gospel today Jesus tells us how to pray and how not to pray. The Pharisee in today's Gospel lists his good deeds and rejoices that he is better than others, especially better than the tax collector nearby who was an outcast for collecting money from his own people for the Roman occupying authority. The tax collector realizes that he needs God, that only God can save him. In his honesty he prays: "O God, be merciful to me a sinner." Jesus says that he went home "justified", accepted by God, unlike the pious Pharisee who was so full of self -praise and judgmental of others. "The prayer of the lowly pierces the clouds" we hear in the First Reading. Can we also be humble and honest before God and confess our need for God and each other? When we pray, let us humbly and gratefully thank God, offer praise, glory and honor to God (not to self), beg for his mercy, and ask for all the help we need to walk forward together in God's love.
