Faith Reflection: In today's Gospel, the Kingdom of Heaven is likened to a marriage feast and in the context of Jesus' parable today, the marriage feast is an image of rejoicing and communion with God. Are we like the people invited to the wedding that attends the feast unworthily choosing not to wear a "wedding garment"? Everyday God invites each of us to his banquet that we may share his joy. How many times do we refuse to put on our wedding garments? In other words we choose not to live the call of the Gospel, not to do good works, not to attend Liturgy on Sunday, not to pray. In short when we refuse to put on the wedding garment, we fail to put into effect the words "all of you who have been baptized into Christ, have put on Christ" because what good is it to put on Christ and do nothing about it? What good is it to say we are Christian and we believe in Jesus Christ, but not actually live it faithfully?

Faith Question: Have I ever thought that other things were more important, or that I was too busy to accept God's invitation to Eucharist, sacraments, prayer, or doing something pleasing to God and helpful to others?

Faith Response: When I am at Mass, I will be more present in heart, mind, and spirit.

OUR PARISH FINANCES

Many thanks to all for your generous contributions to our Church in the Offertory Collection each Sunday. Here is the report for the Offertory Collection on Sunday, September 20th/21st:

This is one of the lowest Sunday collections of the year. Many people must have been out of town this Sunday. We hope to provide the opportunity for Internet Giving very soon so that when you are traveling, you can still support your parish and all the worship, religious, educational and service programs at Our Lady of Mount Carmel. Your generosity is very important to the Church and is very much appreciated. Many thanks and God's blessings on you and your family.



Update on Major Renovation Projects from this summer:

1. Work continues on renovating the men's rest room in the Parish Hall because of a methane gas leak there. Some improve-

ments are also being made to the women's rest room. This means that both rest rooms in the Parish Hall are closed until the work is completed and then both rest rooms will be wheelchair accessible. In the meanwhile the Church rest rooms will be available for use whenever there are activities in the Parish Hall. Cost estimate: \$25,000.

- 2. We are waiting for the new awning installation at the Parish Hall and then the replacement of the awnings at the house and parking area of the home of the Pastor Emeritus. Cost estimate: \$12,670.
- 3. Work is completed on the renovation of the School offices, administrative and faculty area of the School; the painting of the outside of the school buildings; some heating and air conditioning work in the Rectory; and the treatment of a rust problem on the bell structure on the roof of the Church.

We are very grateful to four families who have made generous donations to fund these projects. So far we have received \$19,711 from four parish families. We are also very grateful to a parish family who donated new beautiful tables and chairs for the renovated School faculty room.

WORLD MISSION SUNDAY-

Next weekend, our Parish will celebrate World Mission Sunday. This year, we are invited to reach out and help the Church in Mongolia, the world's youngest Catholic Church, as well as local churches throughout the Missions.
