

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

"Fr. Steve"

"That funny fiscal parable" is how one writer once described the parable of the enterprising steward in today's Gospel. Jesus challenges us to be as enthusiastic and eager about the love of God and people as the dishonest steward in the parable and the shrewd and opportunistic people of the business world. Money has great potential for good. We need it for many good reasons and causes. We can also abuse people over money (as the prophet Amos tells us bluntly in the First Reading today). Jesus suggests that we use money and all the world's goods to "make friends for ourselves...so that when it fails, you will be welcomed into eternal dwellings." We do this by having a heart for people, especially the poor and needy. The barriers between the poor and the rich are broken down as we realize that "God our Savior wills everyone to be saved and come to the knowledge of the truth" (in the words of St. Paul in the Second Reading). Paul also asks for prayers for all in authority or in political life. Prayer for everyone is a prayer that leads to unity and peace, the way of God, our true treasure.

- M-4 is a wonderful working together of the four Churches in Montecito (Our Lady of Mount Carmel, All Saints by the Sea Episcopal Church, El Montecito Presbyterian Church and Montecito Covenant Church). This Fall we are having the M-4 Hike for Haiti on Saturday, October 19th which is aimed at raising funds to build a kitchen at an elementary school in Mirebalais, Haiti, run by a Santa Barbara non-profit organization, Destined for Grace. Next Sunday, September 29th, we will hear a brief presentation at the end of Mass on this Walk for Haiti. Registration forms for the Walk are at the doors of the Church.
- Church Repairs: We are waiting for the delivery of specially prepared wood to replace the wooden beams in the loggia walkway between the Sacristy and the Rest Rooms. The problem is that rain water over the years has caused severe wood rot in the roof supporting beams in two areas of the loggia. The estimated cost for replacing the roof beams is now at \$19,000. We expect that work will begin in two or three weeks time.
