

Learning to love as Jesus has loved us is a lifelong project. To help the family in this endeaver, make JESUS LOVES cards for distribution on a daily basis.



Schedule an evening together for studying the Bible for signs of Jesus' love.
Older children can each be assigned one of the gospels.
Smaller children can work with the parents or an older brother or sister.

Using index cards (or small slips of paper), write down examples of Jesus' love on one side of the card, citing book, chapter, and verse for each example.

Decorate the back side in any way that you want. You can draw pictures of yourself loving as Jesus loved or you can cut pictures from magazines and paste them on your card.



"Love One Another"


In today's gospel story, Jesus tells us to love one another just as he has loved us. What are some of the ways that Jesus has loved his people?

Jesus is always quick to forgive those who say they are sorry. You can love like Jesus loves by forgiving those who hurt you and by saying, "I'm sorry," when you have hurt someone else.



Jesus Makes Three Promises

In this week's gospel story,
Jesus makes wonderful promises.
His promises are for everyone — you and me and all our friends. Jesus promised us that if we really, truly love him, and try to keep his commandments, God the Father will come to us and live in our hearts for all time.

Then Jesus makes a second promise, more wonderful than the first. He promises us that the Father will send the Holy Spirit to us, to help us understand all that Jesus came to teach us.

Finally, he makes a third promise, and this one he calls his gift: "My peace is my gift to you. Do not be distressed or afraid. I go away for a little while, but I will come back to you."



Three marvelous promises: the Father, the Son, and the Spirit will come to be with us — to live with us, to teach us all we need to know, and to bring us peace when we are worried or afraid.
